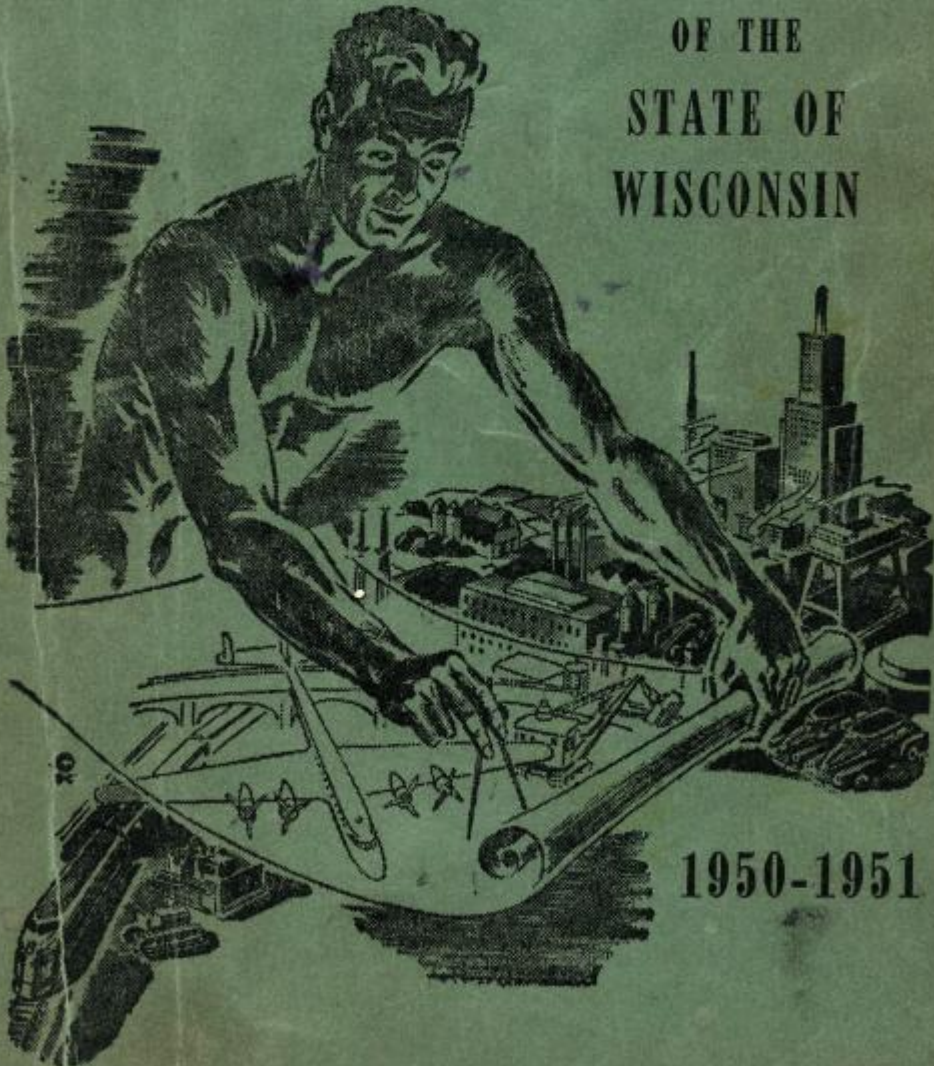

From our institutions have come Statesmen, Scientists, Doctors, Lawyers, Educators, Writers, Merchants and Athletes.

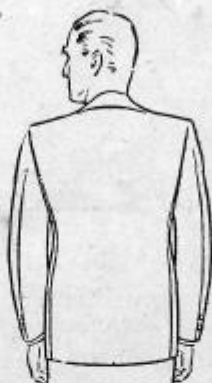
To the pioneers of these frontiers do we owe our progress of today, and only by persistent pioneering can we reach our full potential.

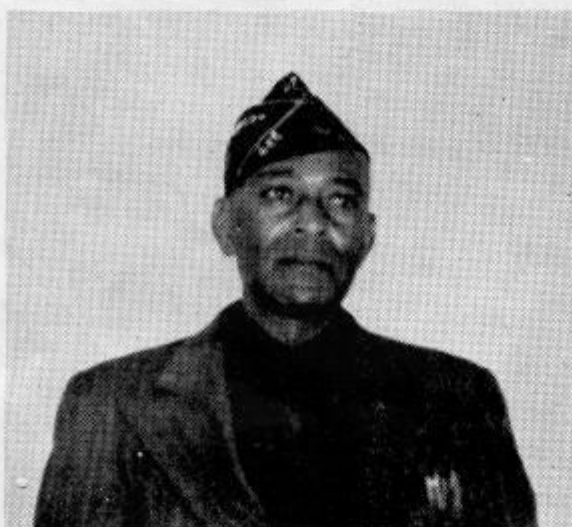

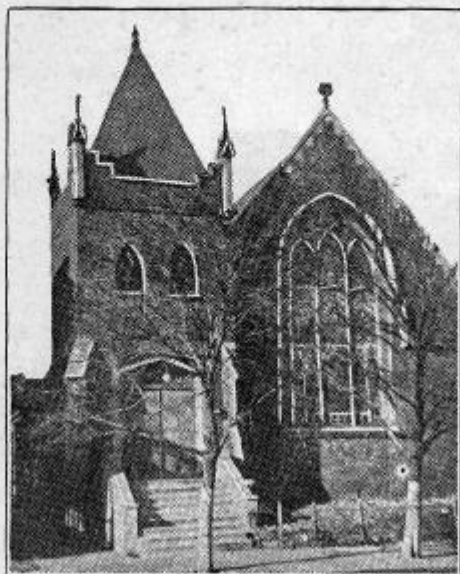

CALVARY BAPTIST CHURCH

Calvary was organized 1895. The oldest Negro *Baptist* Church in Wisconsin. It is affiliated with the Northern Baptist Convention and the National Baptist Convention. It has a membership of 1,100. Twenty groups comprise its organization. Its Annual School of Missions, Daily Vacation Bible School, Leadership Training Course, Church Convention made up of auxiliaries of the church, and its seven weeks Lenten services with lay assistants make it an outstanding institutional church. Its services are of a high caliber and those who worship there receive a spiritual and cultural uplift. It contributes largely to education, missions and social service. It has recently constructed a \$35,000.00 annex. Canaan Baptist Church was organized in 1940 at 919 W. Galena Street by the General Baptist State Convention with the Pastor, Rev. S. Norton, Mrs. Norton and their two children. They later purchased a frame building at 756 West Reservoir, and on that same site built the first church ever to be built from the ground up by Negroes in Milwaukee.

The church property is valued at \$20,000 and consists of a cafeteria, pastor's office and a main auditorium with a balcony. Canaan Baptist church has a membership of over 500 persons.

GALILEE BAPTIST CHURCH

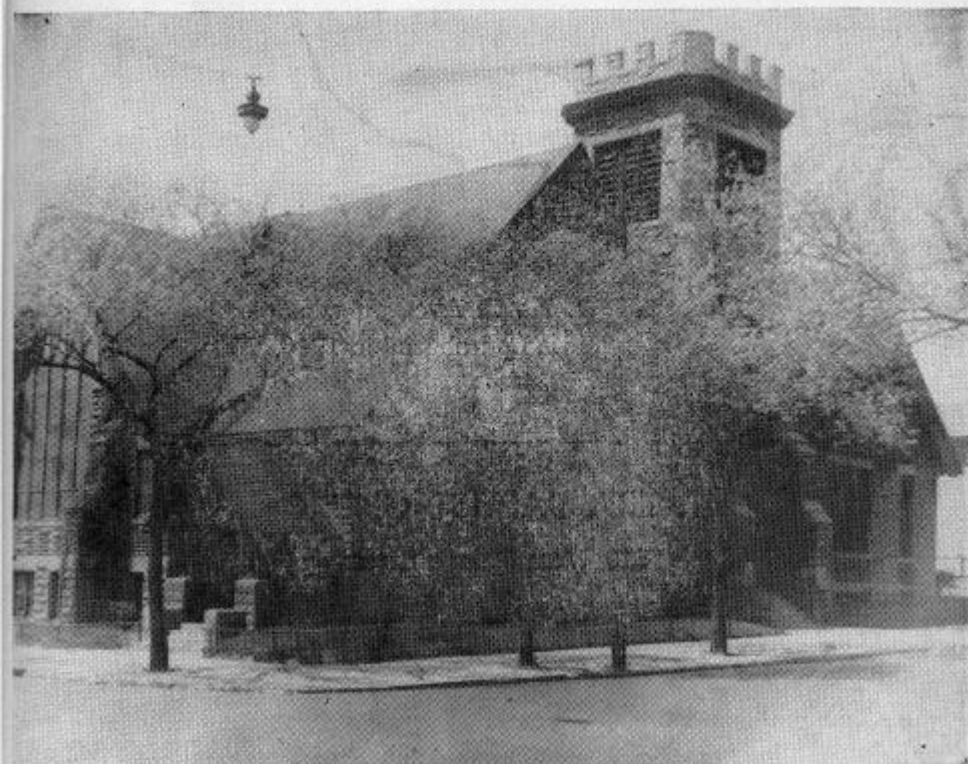
The GALILEE BAPTIST CHURCH was organized April 18th, 1920, at 838 West Vliet Street. It has been of great help and advancement to a humble and peace loving people of this community for the past 30 years. The founder of the church, the Rev. James Moore, pastored only a short while before leaving the city to take up a work in Detroit, where he resides at the present time. The church has had five pastors during the past 30 years. Following Rev. Moore, the church was pastored by the Rev. B. L. Mathews for about nine years, Rev. R. C. Schultz about three years and the Rev. C. H. Brumfield from Chicago for 14½ years, and the Rev. H W Cunningham, the present pastor.

In 1939, the name of this church was legally changed from Galilee to the Greater Galilee Baptist Church because of the splendid strides the church had made.

The church remained at its old location until July 4, 1943, when it moved to the present address, 808-10 West Walnut Street. This building is a wonderful building valued at \$40,000. It was built in 1912 and used as the Northside Auditorium. It will accommodate in its main auditorium 700 people, including its spacious large balcony, pastor's private office, church office, janitor's apartment, large convenient lounging room for women and men, comfortable rest rooms, and three choir stands. The first floor has a large dining hall accommodating kitchen and two lovely stores. Social activities can be held without going to the second floor.

Under the present pastors efficient administration, the church has increased numerically and financially. In the short span of ten months under the present pastor's leadership, there has been more than 100 persons added to the church membership, and 30 or more were candidates for baptism.

METROPOLITAN BAPTIST CHURCH

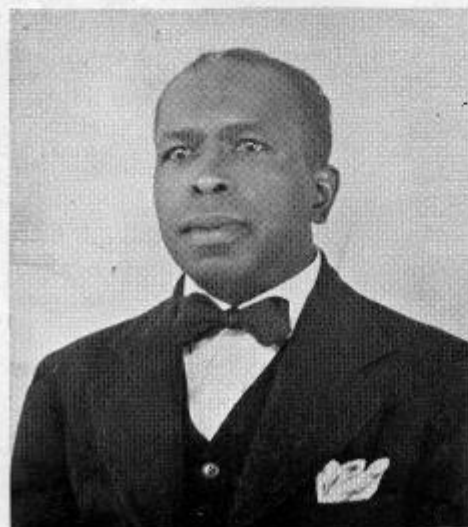

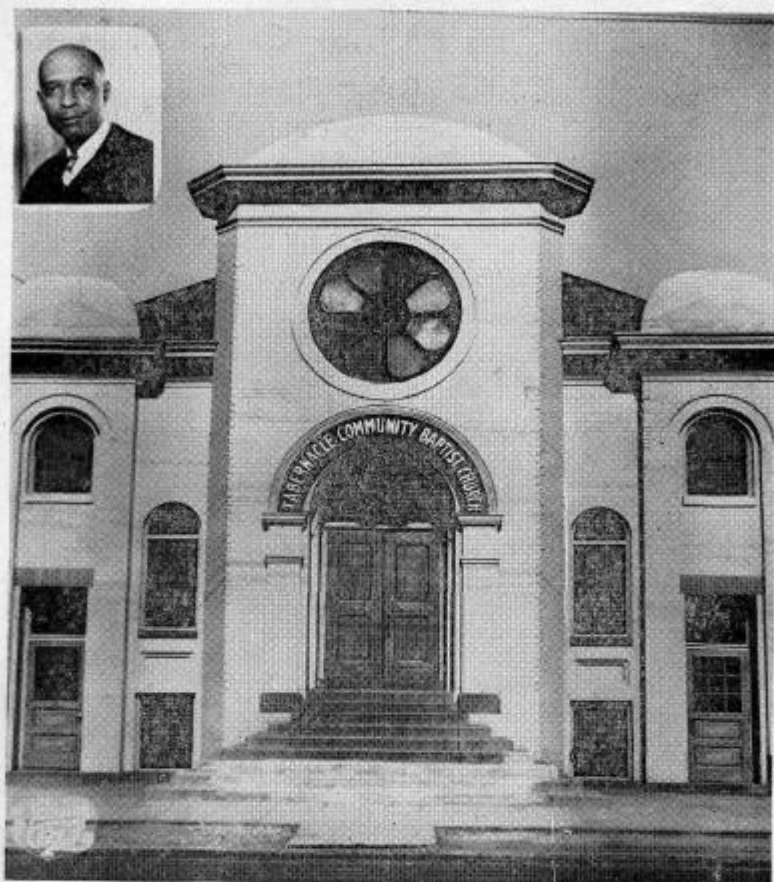

Tabernacle Community Baptist Church

"A Greater Tabernacle for God and Humanity"

The Church was organized in 1922 by the name of St. Paul Baptist Church, under the leadership of the Rev. Hooks. He was succeeded by Rev. Johnson. Each pastored about three years. The late Rev. R. H. Foy was called to pastor in 1932 and pastored three years, during which time he succeeded in getting the Church's name changed from St. Paul to Tabernacle. Later he resigned.

The Church then called Rev. J. L. Williams on March 15, 1936, with a membership of about 55. Its financial status was very poor. About 20 years of the Church's existence, struggling against the odds of the depression, it was forced to move from store front to store front renting. During that period the Church was unable to support its Pastor, but under the wise and courageous leadership of Rev. J. L. Williams, in 1943, the Church succeeded in purchasing a property at 834-36-38 W. Walnut St. for \$7,000.00 and now holds the deed and abstract title to it.

In 1945 the Church also purchased its Church building at 1632 N. 10th St. for \$15,000 and holds deed and abstract title to it, and is now well able to support its Pastor with a membership of over 1,100 members.

The Rev. J. L. Williams, D.D., Pastor, is a dynamic preacher and a great leader. He is a graduate of the Automatic Evangelical Correspondence School of Boise, Idaho, and is now Moderator of the General Baptist State Association of Wisconsin.

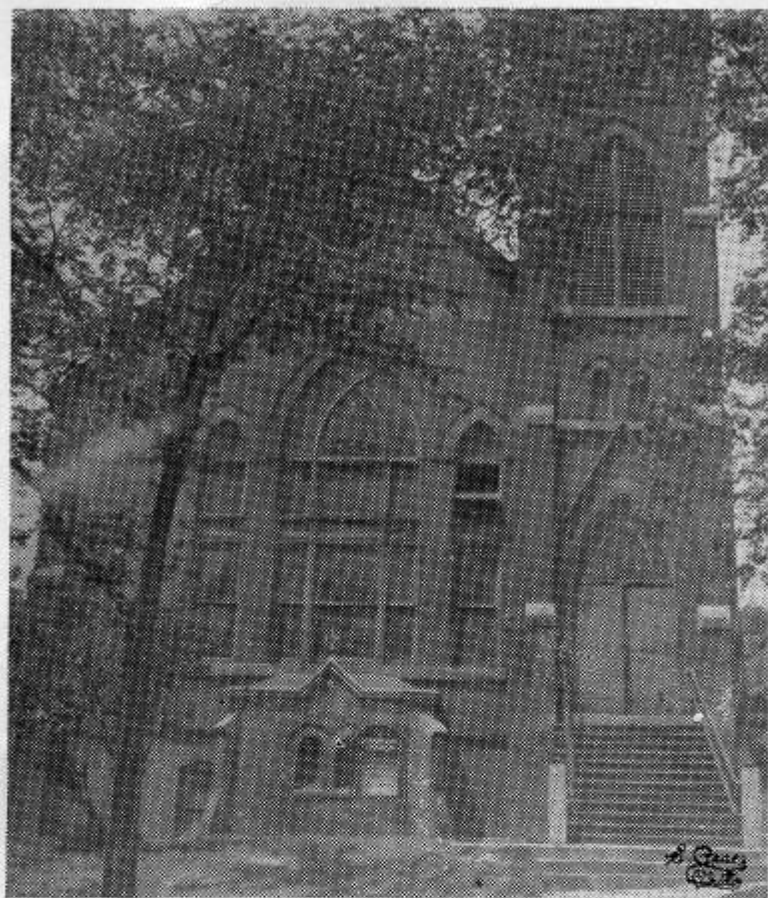

St. Matthew C.M.E. Church was organized in 1918 under the leadership of Rev. W. S. Ferguson, his wife and daughter, and the following persons: Monroe Thompson, Charles Meminger, Lonnie Eubanks. The church was organized at the home of Rev. Ferguson at 828 West Vliet Street. The following persons joined shortly after organization: Laura Manghum, Alvin Thompson, Mr. and Mrs. Shelton, Mr. and Mrs. David Burroughs, Mr. and Mrs. Davis, and Mr. and Mrs. Hilary Bracey and son, and Mr. and Mrs. Orville Mosely, Mrs. Davis was the first missionary president. These members worshipped at a church at 5th and Galena for two years.

The Bishops for St. Matthew have been Bishops Jamison, Carter, Hamlet, Martin, Bray and the present Bishop R. A. Carter. The Elders were Elders Rivers, Coggins, Womack, Turner, Allen, Crowder, Murchison, and the present Elder T. C. Lightfoot, Sr. The pastors were Rev. W. S. Ferguson, G. W. Samples, W. H. Parks, W. M. Crane, W. M. Goodwin, J. T. Cockran, W. H. Anderson, G. S. Smith, J. W. Barnett, H. N. Rhodes, H. C. Coggins, and the present pastor, Rev. W. J. G. McLin.

The present church was purchased May, 1919, with the first named members paying \$25.00 each, and today is one of the leading churches in the state of Wisconsin.

ST. MARKS AFRICAN METHODIST EPISCOPAL CHURCH

"The Friendly Church"

St. Marks the first church of its kind to be organized in the State of Wisconsin was organized in 1869 with eight members, at a room the eight members rented at Number One, Spring Street, now known as Wisconsin Ave., and the building was located on the present Gimbels site. The first pastor was Rev. Theodore Crosby.

June 25, 1869 St. Marks purchased the church on the corner of 4th and Cedar streets at that time the church was known as The First African Methodist Episcopal Church of Milwaukee, Wisconsin. In 1883 the old church building was condemned but it was not until 1886 under the pastorate of Rev. W. R. Alexander that the work of razing and rebuilding the new structure was begun March, 1887, the basement was completed and used for worship, and in May, 1887, the entire building was ready for occupancy. It was at this first service that the name was changed to "St. Marks African Methodist Episcopal Church, however it still retains its corporate name in legal affairs.

Rev. H. E. Stewart, the former pastor, through his tolerance and fatherly spirit and rich understanding helped to rid the church of debt. The present pastor is Rev. John Bradford.

St. Marks has been a guiding light to the community and has kept pace with the growth and advancement in Milwaukee.

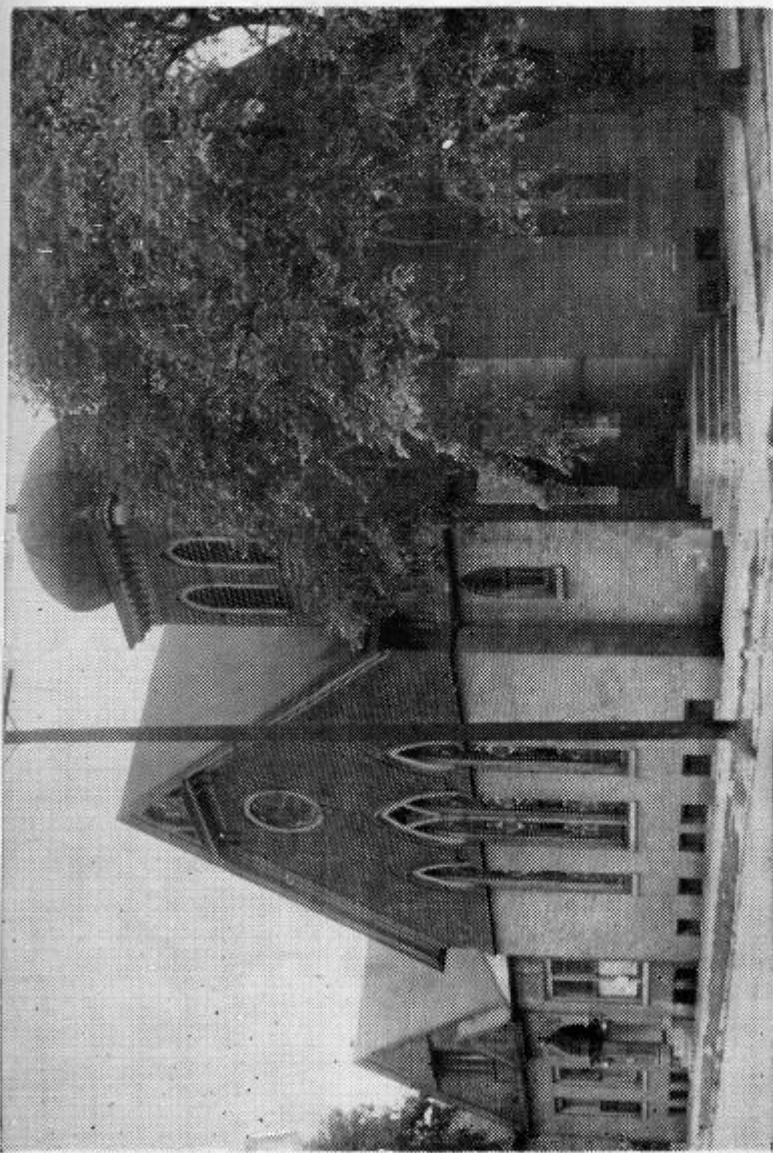

They are the teachers—Over fifty per cent of Negro college graduates are teachers, but with only one Negro teacher for every 201 pupils, an estimated 16,000 additional ones are needed.

They are the Doctors, Dentists, Nurses—The majority receive pre-medical and professional training in private Negro colleges, but there are still only 4,000 Negro doctors—1,600 dentists—9,000 nurses in the whole United States.

They are the social workers—Filling a need created by the present economic, health and social levels of the Negro population.

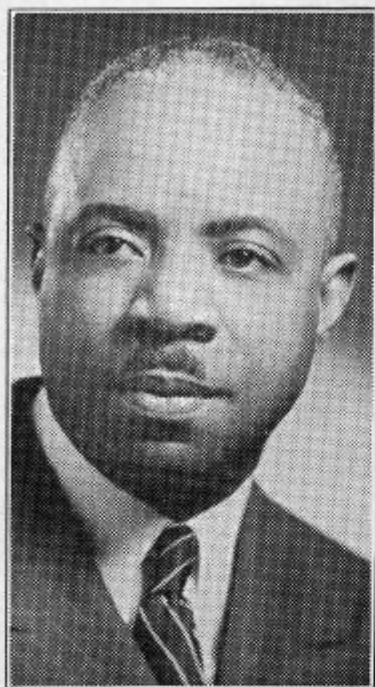
REV. C. A. FISHER

Fisher has played a wonderful part in reducing delinquency among our youth thereby proving that Negro children are no more susceptible to vice than any other children.

 Assemblyman LeRoy J. Simmons was born in Milwaukee and is a member of one of the oldest, if not the oldest Negro families in Milwaukee, his family having settled here in 1865 in the person of his Grandfather Calvin Reeves.

Mr. Simmons is the second Negro to be elected to public office in the history of the State in over 40 years. He started his first term in the State Legislature in 1945 representing the 6th Milwaukee District comprising the 6th ward. He is now serving his 3rd consecutive term. He is the only Negro holding an elected position in Wisconsin.

He is a Democrat and has the honor and distinction of being the only Negro in the United States history to preside over a State Legislature. This noteworthy event took place in May, 1949. The benefits achieved by racial, labor and minority groups through his sincere and forceful campaign against Discrimination have been many. He successfully fought the University of Wisconsin on their points of discrimination, and now for the first time Negroes have been admitted to the school of Medicine in Wisconsin.

In 1945 he successfully sponsored the State F.E.P.C. law and Wisconsin became the 3rd state in the Union to have an anti-Discrimination Law in Industry.

He is also responsible for laws against discrimination in Public Schools, Veteran Housing, National Guard Units, also a law against dangerous drugs. He received his schooling in Milwaukee and in Chicago and is engaged in the Real Estate Business. He is married, his wife Alma is a former beauty shop operator, he has three children, Lenore, Maurice, and Constance. He attends St. Marks A.M.E. Church, is a member of the Democrat Party, N.A.A.C.P. and the Y.M.C.A. Masonic Lodge Blazing Star No 4.

Review of Societies

AFRO AMERICAN NATIONAL ECONOMICAL SOCIETY

The above named society was organized in 1939, and incorporated in May, 1940 with approximately 100 members. The purpose of the society is to gain cooperation of the Negro people in starting and operating industrial plants in order to make the Negro economically strong enough to employ their own people. Its purpose is also to work for the civic, charitable and social welfare of all people. This organization has many units throughout the country, and open for membership.

CREAM CITY MEDICAL SOCIETY

Cream City Medical Society was organized in 1927 by the late Dr. Richard Herron. The Doctors in the city of Milwaukee meet once a month and discuss various problems and new ideas in their profession. The president of the society is Dr. James M. Carter, and the secretary is Dr. Peter Murrell.

DOUGLAS AID SOCIETY

The Douglas Aid Society was organized October, 1941 under its present leader, Mr. Leon Nath Norton, and was incorporated April 27, 1942.

Its aim and object is to help poor, sick, old, suffering and destitute people, irrespective of race, creed or color.

This society pays to its members for sick benefits \$1.50 a week or \$6.00 per month, and this can be increased whenever its members agree to do so. The society has been of great benefit to this community by visiting sick and helping needy people whether they were members of the society or not.

Your Urban League and Mine

Although the Milwaukee Urban League has operated in Milwaukee for more than 25 years, many people still ask the question, "What Is the Urban League?" Briefly, the League is simply this:

It is an affiliate of a national movement which was organized in New York City in 1910. The name at that time was the National League on Urban Conditions Among Negroes. For some reason, the name was subsequently shortened to that of the National Urban League. Today, there are 68 affiliated branches throughout the country, with Milwaukee being one of them. The purpose of the local Urban League is clearly stated in its charter which was granted by the State of Wisconsin in 1919 as follows:

"... business and purpose being to promote, encourage, assist and engage in any and all kinds of work for improving the industrial, economic, and social conditions among Negroes in Milwaukee and vicinity."

Because the Urban League movement regards the matter of employment as the most fundamental need among Negroes, major emphasis is placed upon this phase of the Urban League program. Some of the accomplishments of the local League may be stated as follows:

Thousands of Negroes have been placed in permanent and temporary employment. In recent years many industrial plants, public utilities, and department stores have opened their doors to Negro employees for the first time through the efforts of the local League. The demand for workers through the free employment service of the League is at times, far greater than the available supply. There is scarcely a Negro of any special training or skill who cannot be placed through the League.

Because of the dearth of trained people, the League has embarked upon a special program of vocational counseling with the hope of encouraging Negroes to take advantage of facilities offered through the Milwaukee Vocational School.

In 1931, when it became apparent that Negroes were going to be the chief sufferers resulting from the depression, the local League expanded its program to offer limited recreational facilities to individuals who were forced into idleness. From December 1, 1931, until September 30, 1932, the total attendance at all activities sponsored by the Urban League was in excess of 56,000. This was the peak year. Attendance has been as low as 47,000 for a single year since that time.

In keeping with its declared purpose, the League has attempted to meet other needs of the community in the matters of health and recreation. The first W.P.A. nursery school in Milwaukee was sponsored by the Urban League as an interracial venture. After two years of such service, the attendance of young children was greater than could be accommodated by the facilities offered, and the project was transferred to another location in the neighborhood.

In the interest of health, chest and blood clinics were also co-sponsored by the Urban League, and the City and State Health Departments, respectively. These, too, outgrew the facilities available to them in the Urban League building, and now operate in other locations.

In 1943 we were faced with the need of community organization, and the League added to its staff a community organization secretary. The local League now employs nine full time staff members, and three part time workers. Were it not for the scores of volunteers, both white and Negro, it would be necessary to curtail the program which is now in force.

The entire Urban League movement, including the Milwaukee Urban League, is inter-racial in its organizational structure. Such emphasis has been placed upon this type of program, that the League has in recent years become known as an **INTER-RACIAL AGENCY FOR SOCIAL SERVICE AMONG NEGROES**.

In an effort to comply with recommendations of a survey made in 1943 of public and private Health and Welfare Agencies in Milwaukee County, the League is currently terminating its recreational services to juveniles, and transferring such programs to other agencies in the neighborhood better equipped from the standpoints of equipment and personnel, to do the job—all on a non-segregated basis.

N.A.A.C.P.

The National Association for the Advancement of Colored People was organized by Mrs. Mary Overton in Springfield, Ill., in 1909. The N. A. A. C. P. was organized for the purpose of fighting for civil rights of minority groups, especially the Negro; and the protection of their constitutional rights.

The first branch in Milwaukee was organized by the late attorney George W. DeReef. Past presidents have been Dr. Edgar Thomas, Mr. Wilbur Halyard, Dr. P. Jay Gilmer, and Attorney James W. Dorsey, Attorney Andrew Reneau and Mr. Grant Gordon. The present president is Attorney Theodore W. Coggs.

Cases that have been successfully fought by the local Milwaukee Branch were the banning of the picture "The Birth of a Nation", never to be shown in Milwaukee; the Lively Lewis Extortion cases; the Joe Hale case (Mr. Hale was to have been electrocuted in the state of Kentucky. The decision was reversed. He has since been paroled); the Shorewood School Board Discrimination case; and a strenuous fight for a Fair Employment Practice Committee. The Young Womens' Christian Association has been a fine influence in Milwaukee over 54 years. Spearheaded by the concern of the Board of Directors, it was more than 25 years ago that Do Shi Kai, a Girl Reserve club, was organized and a bit later, La Circle, an industrial girls' group. Then, the regular meeting place was the downtown "Y. W." Center on the sixth floor of the Alhambra Building. Pioneering in those early years were Mesdames Minnie Badger, Mattie Gant and Anna P. Thomas as volunteers and Misses Jeanette Kiskaddon and Florence Pride, staff members.

The years have seen an ever growing and expanding program. World War I saw Y. W. people assisting with the soldiers recreation at their Third Street center and in World War II, it was U. S. O.

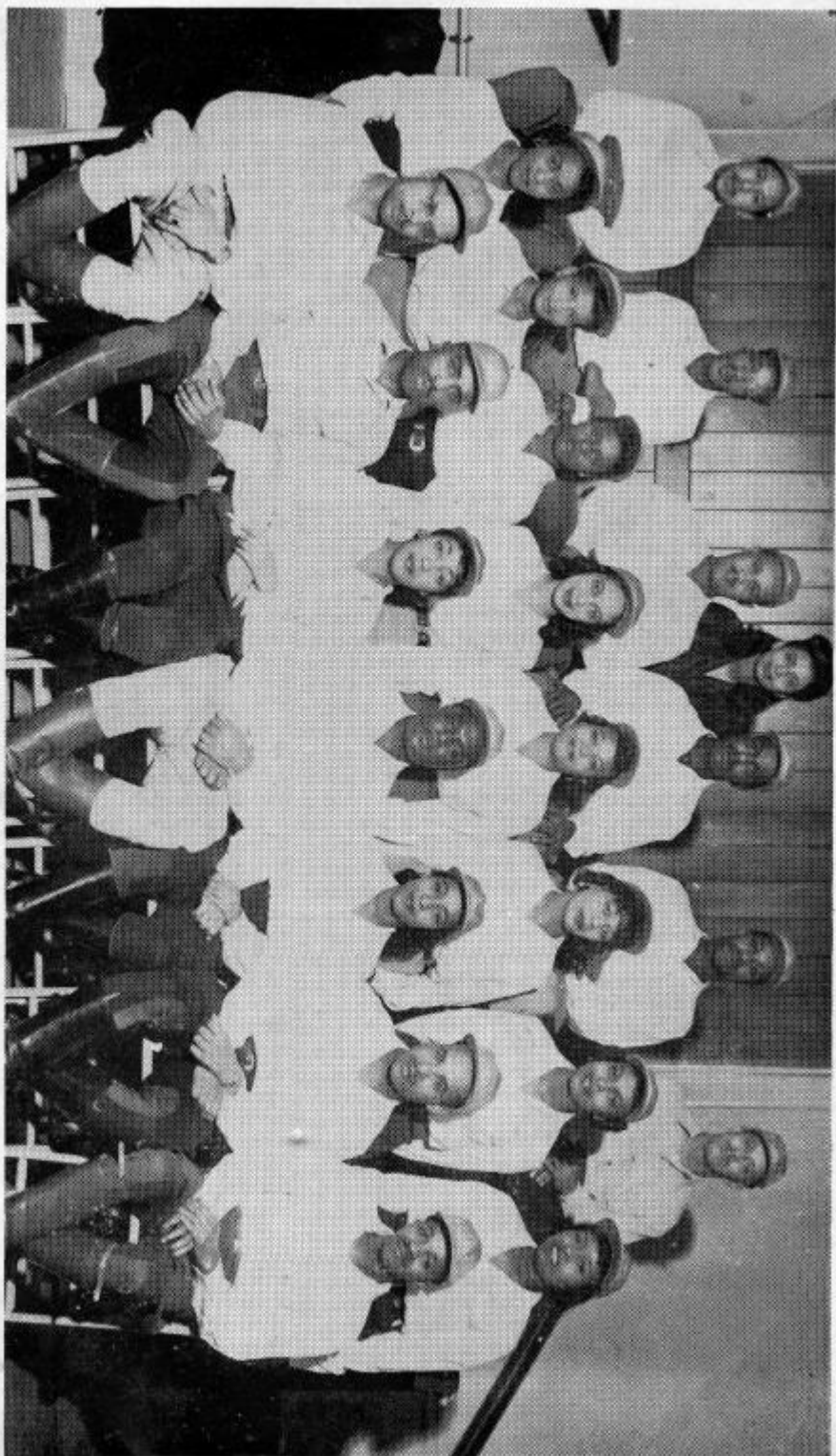

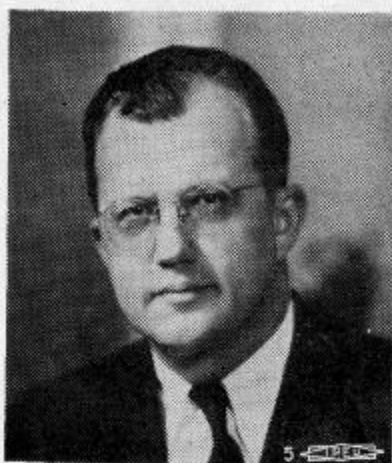

Biographical Data for Andrew J. Biemiller, Member of Congress, 5th District, Milwaukee, Wis.

Born Sandusky Ohio 1906

Educated public schools of Sandusky, Cornell University 1926.
(attributes attitude on civil rights in part to going to unsegregated schools all his life.)

Taught history at universities of Syracuse and Pennsylvania.

Came to Milwaukee 1932. Engaged in newspaper and education work.

1936—elected to state legislature, representing second largest Negro district in Milwaukee.

Worked with **Assemblyman Ben Rubin** on Wisconsin non-discrimination law, which was passed in 1939.

1941—Came to Washington to work with War Production Board. Helped make FEPC effective in his work on labor morale problems with various plants all over the country.

1944—Elected to Congress.

1946—Defeated

1948—Led fight with Hubert Humphrey of Minnesota for strong civil rights plank at Democratic National convention. Wisconsin's votes in convention won adoption of minority plank.

1948—Elected to Congress. Appointed to committee on Interstate and Foreign Commerce.

Active in fight to pass poll tax bill in House, and advance FEPC and other civil rights legislation. Author of school health bill, which would mean more to Negro schools than to others.

Help Your City to Help You

Here Are the Main Provisions of Milwaukee's
New Garbage, Ash, and Rubbish Ordinance

GARBAGE

WHAT IS IT

Garbage is animal, fish, fowl, fruit, or vegetable matter, and shall be drained of all free liquid and wrapped in several thicknesses of paper and placed in an approved container

"Domestic garbage" is collected free. This is the garbage resulting from residential housekeeping. There is a charge for collecting "commercial garbage." That is, garbage resulting from the operation of offices, stores, factories, and similar commercial enterprises, and other organizations.

WHAT YOU SHOULD DO

The owner, lessee, or managing agent of multiple dwellings and the occupant of a single or two-family dwelling shall provide metal garbage cans each having at least two handles, a tight fitting cover and a capacity of not less than 20 nor more than 32 gallons. No single receptacle shall weigh more than 100 pounds when filled. Enough containers must be provided to hold at least two weeks' accumulation. Containers must be placed on the ground floor and near the alley or driveway, convenient for the collectors, and should not be kept where they become a nuisance to the neighbors.

ASHES AND RUBBISH

WHAT IT IS

"Municipal ashes and rubbish" means discarded products incidental to housekeeping and commercial enterprises, not including garbage. It must be separated as to combustible and non-combustible materials. This means that papers or anything that burns should be kept separate from such things as ashes and tin cans.

There is a charge for collecting "commercial ashes and rubbish." This is the miscellaneous waste material from a business enterprise or other non-residential use. It includes rubbish and ashes from offices, stores, factories, and similar commercial enterprises, and other organizations, and includes construction waste.

"Domestic ashes and rubbish" is collected free. This means ashes and rubbish from residences.

WHAT YOU SHOULD DO

The owner, lessee, or managing agent of multiple dwellings and the occupant of a single or two-family dwelling shall provide enough metal baskets, one bushel in size, with good and sufficient handles, to hold 30 days' accumulation of rubbish and ashes. Stationary receptacles (ash boxes) for rubbish and ashes may be provided in lieu of baskets, provided that such boxes shall not be located inside any building containing a dwelling unit. These boxes shall be of concrete, or other durable material so as to be waterproof, rodentproof, fireproof, and easily emptied. All such boxes shall be upon private property and not upon any street, alley, or public ground. Metal baskets in cellars or basements of residences shall be within 12 feet of a convenient door or window large enough for them to be passed in or out; provided further, that the distance from the storage location to the vehicle to be loaded is not more than 125 feet.

All residents are urged to cooperate with the City authorities in this garbage and waste collection service, so that the best service possible may be had. Report all complaints to the Department of Public Works, DA. 8-3711, Extension 133 or 134.

The first Negro police officer in the Milwaukee Department was a Patrolman by the name of Judson Walter Minor. He was appointed on October 13th, 1924 and became separated from the Police Service on December 21, 1926.

Here in Milwaukee, we have a Volunteer Committee, which fights to better the health of our Negro Community. Won't you help by assuring yourself that you and your family are free from tuberculosis? Have that X-ray!

FIRST AID INFORMATION

ANTIDOTES FOR POISON

ACID—CALL DOCTOR—Give all milk and water patient can drink—also egg-whites. Milk of Magnesia is an excellent antidote when used as directed.

ALCOHOL—CALL DOCTOR—Never make an unconscious person drink anything.

ALKALIES, LYE, AMMONIA, ETC.—CALL DOCTOR—Dilute vinegar or lemon juice in water and give to patient.

ARSENIC, RAT POISON—CALL DOCTOR—Milk, raw egg, sweet oil, lime water, flour and water. Follow with stimulants.

STRYCHNINE—CALL DOCTOR—Mustard and water, as an antidote, to make patient vomit. Keep patient quiet, plug the ears.

BITES

SNAKE—Bites from the coral, rattlesnake, copper-head, and cotton-mouth moccasin are dangerous and treatment should be started while waiting for the doctor. The patient should lie quietly when a tourniquet is applied above the wound. With a sterile blade or knife a crosscut incision $\frac{1}{4}$ inch long and $\frac{1}{4}$ inch deep should be made. Apply mouth suction (spitting out venom) or use suction cup for $\frac{1}{2}$ hour, repeating every hour until doctor arrives.

SPIDER OR INSECT—Apply ammonia diluted one teaspoonful to a glass of water, or cover the wound with soda (sodium bicarbonate); or lay on a compress wet with cold boric acid solution or vinegar. If poisonous place an ice compress over the wound and CALL A DOCTOR.

APPENDICITIS—CALL DOCTOR—Put the patient to bed, give neither food nor laxative. A hot water bottle should not be used, but an ice-bag may be applied until the doctor comes.

BURNS—Grease skin. Moroline or other clear grease. Tannic acid solution, or put patient in bath of water just barely warm. CALL A DOCTOR.

CRUSHED HAND OR FOOT—CALL A DOCTOR—Apply padded splints to the part crushed. Raising foot will relieve pain.

CUTS OR PUNCTURES—When bleeding occurs pressure is the best method to control it. Push first available material into the wound holding it in place with bandage or hand to make pressure. If possible apply a tourniquet.

DISLOCATIONS—CALL DOCTOR—Patient should be put in comfortable position covering the injured joint with cloths wrung out in very hot or very cold water, to prevent swelling as much as possible.

EARACHE—Three to four drops of warm glycerine placed in the ear. Earaches may mean beginning mastoiditis or tonsillitis and REQUIRES A DOCTOR'S CARE.

EYE WOUNDS—CALL DOCTOR—Cover both eyes with absorbent cotton or soft

cloth and keep soaked in cool water until the services of a doctor can be procured.

FAINING—Lay patient flat or feet slightly higher than head—loosen clothes—keep warm—smell ammonia. Do not put anything in the mouth.

FISHHOOK WOUNDS—Do not attempt to pull out a fishhook after it has entered the flesh. Depress hook pushing point forward and upward and out at another point. Cut off the barbed end with a wire cutter or file, then remove hook without damage to tissues and treat the wound with iodine. Do not remove a fishhook from the eye but CONSULT THE NEAREST DOCTOR.

FRACTURES OR BROKEN BONES—A fracture or break should be set as soon as possible. But until the doctor arrives, the best treatment consists in handling the injured parts very carefully and applying a splint to hold the part in position. These may be improvised from narrow boards, heavy pasteboard, eaves and the like but must be padded when applied next to the skin to check circulation and long enough to prevent movement. Never move a person with a broken bone unless the part is tied with a splint.

GAS, DROWNING AND SUFFOCATION—CALL DOCTOR—If you can't give artificial respiration, get the nearest Boy Scout, fireman or policeman. See that patient has fresh air and is kept warm. Keep patient lying flat.

GUNSHOT WOUNDS—Apply sterile dressing till a doctor can be found, stop bleeding if possible. If bowels protrude, do not attempt to put them back but cover with sterile cloths soaked in a pint of boiled lukewarm water containing a teaspoonful of salt. Chest wounds are serious. Cover with sterile gauze or hospital clean linen.

INTERNAL INJURIES—CALL DOCTOR—THE best emergency dressing is a towel placed over the injury wrung out in warm water. It is advisable to use more than one layer of toweling.

POISON OAK OR IVY—A wash of boric acid solution in water followed by ordinary zinc ointment. This should be covered by a thin cloth only. A good country remedy is made by putting a copper penny in vinegar and using as a wash.

SHOCK (Caused by bad news or most always by an accident)—CALL DOCTOR—Then lay patient flat or feet slightly higher than head—loosen clothes—keep warm, not hot, and quiet. Give stimulant, like aromatic spirits of ammonia in water, when conscious—not liquor.

SUNSTROKE—Place patient in recumbent position, raise the head slightly. Cool the skin as quickly as possible with cold cloths or ice packs, especially around the head. Give no stimulant.

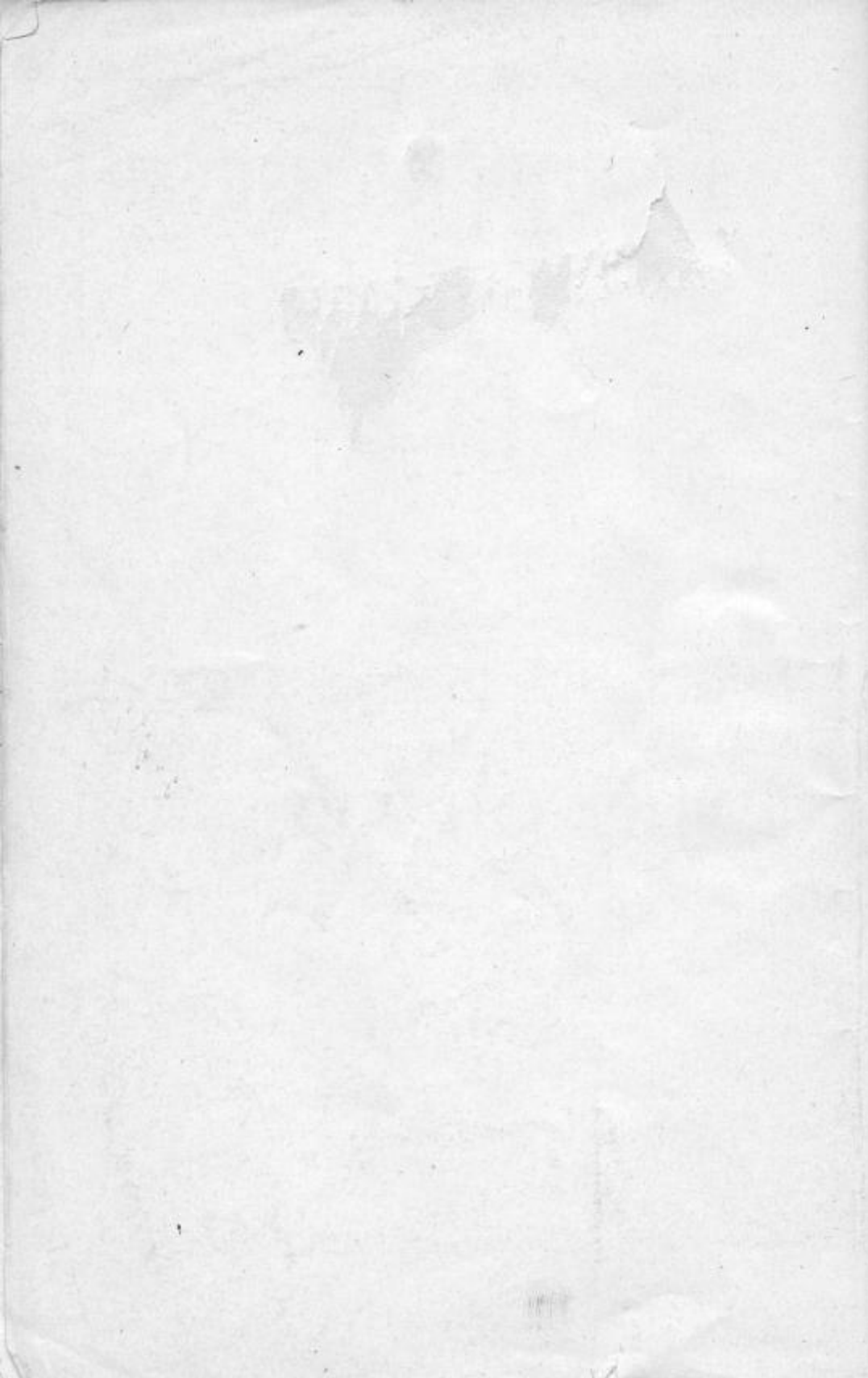
